

FRANCE – GARONNE RIVER FROM BORDEAUX TO TOULOUSE

7-days/ 6-nights **SELF-GUIDED** inn-to-inn cycling in Southwest France



Bordeaux is world-renowned as a centre for great wine and food. This leisurely self-guided cycling holiday starts (or ends) in the UNESCO World Heritage-listed city of Bordeaux and offers the opportunity to sample many of the treasures of the Bordeaux and Entre-Deux-Mers regions along the Garonne River. The food of course is a highlight: *confit du canard* (confit duck leg), foie gras, steak *bordelaise*, local oysters and mussels, and the signature pastry of Bordeaux city, the *cannelé*, a caramelised cake filled with rum and vanilla-flavoured custard.

Your cycling route follows the Canal de Garonne, lined with shady plane trees, through vineyards and past small villages. There are some rolling hills, but otherwise the ride is generally flattish and covers modest daily distances, so there is plenty of time to linger over breakfast or take a long relaxing lunch. Inn-to-inn self-guided cycling holidays are a perfect way to explore France, with the freedom and flexibility to travel at your own pace.

Departs: Daily (except Saturdays & Sundays in July/August) from April to October

Route: Bordeaux to Toulouse (or Toulouse to Bordeaux)

Included: 6 nights in guesthouses or 3-star hotels with private bathroom facilities; 6 breakfasts, 2 dinners; inn-to-inn luggage transfers (one bag per person, up to 20kg); hire of multi-gear hybrid bike with lock, repair kit, pannier, handlebar bag, and helmet; full route notes and map package (one set per room) and GPS tracks; emergency hotline. **E-bikes** can be hired at additional cost (limited availability, request when booking).

Not Included: Other meals not mentioned, drinks, entry fees, transfers to or from the tour, unscheduled transfers needed during the tour, local city tourist taxes.

Suggested itinerary:

Day 1: Arrival day

Make your way to your hotel in Bordeaux around mid-afternoon. Your package of route notes, maps and your bike will await your collection.

Day 2: Bordeaux to the Entre-Deux-Mers

cycling @ 45-60km

Ride along the Garonne River passing beautiful quays into the 'Entre-Deux-Mers' area. The greenway trail winds along to the magnificent fortified walled towns of Creon and Sauveterre de Guyenne before you take small roads surrounded by vineyards to your guesthouse for tonight's stay, with dinner included.

Day 3: Canal de Garonne from Sauveterre region

cycling @ 25-55km

Your cycling route crosses vineyards and forests at the start of the Canal de Garonne from near Sauveterre to the Meilhan region. With the option of a shorter day, you can enjoy a leisurely pace with plenty of time to stop along the way. Dinner is also included tonight.

Day 4: Meilhan region to Sérignac sur Garonne

cycling @ 55-60km

Continue along the Garonne valley passing orchards and under plane trees, taking in small towns like Buzet, Meilhan-sur-Garonne, Buzet-sur-Baise and Le Mas d'Agen before arriving in the thirteenth century village of Sérignac, a haven of peace on the canal.

Day 5: Sérignac sur Garonne to Moissac

cycling @ 60km

Plenty of sights to enjoy along this gentle route such as the canal bridge on the Baise, the aqueduct Agen Auvillar, Lake Saint-Nicolas-de-la-Grave to Moissac. This small town is an important stop on the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage route; you may like to visit the 12th century abbey and cloisters. Enjoy the quiet this evening at the hotel with panoramic views where the Garonne and Tarn meet.

Day 6: Moissac to Toulouse

cycling @ 65km

A lovely ride through rural villages with Gothic churches in Tarn-et-Garonne. Visit the Montech Marina with its unique water slope, a sloping channel that allows larger vessels to move between lower and higher water levels, bypassing the five locks used by smaller boats. Plenty of time to explore Toulouse where the rosy-toned brick buildings have a special glow, earning the city its nickname *La Ville Rose* (the Pink City). Enjoy the architecture, visit the famous Place du Capitole or the UNESCO listed 11th century Basilique Saint-Sernin.

Day 7: Departure day

Tour arrangements end after breakfast. Extra nights can be arranged in Bordeaux or Toulouse, ask us for details.
