

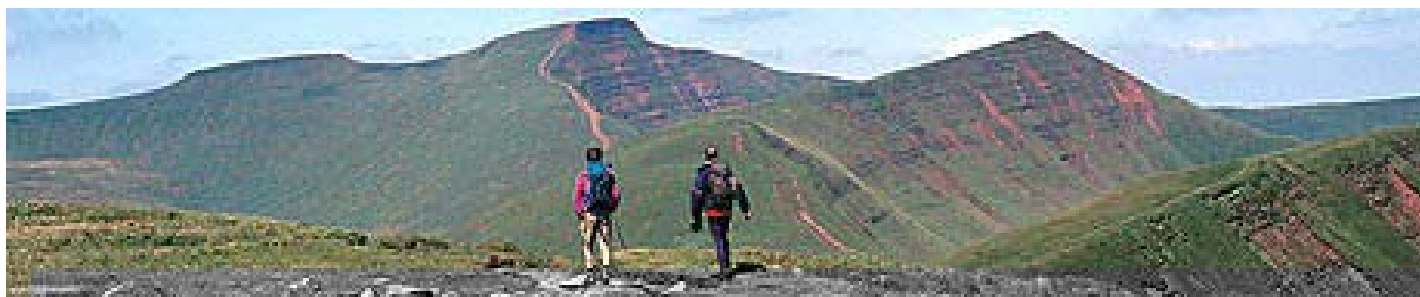

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WALKING IN BRITAIN

Centre-based walks in Southern Yorkshire Dales

If you are new to walking, start at the easiest level, where the pace is the gentlest on one of our many centre-based or one-hotel group guided walking holidays.

We have plenty of stops to enjoy the views and to rest. As your holiday progresses you may feel confident to try a more challenging level, or stick to the same level - it's entirely your choice. The walks program may be adjusted to suit the season, weather conditions, accessibility or guest numbers. All levels cross a combination of riverside, fields and woodland, and pass through villages. Walking is on good paths often over stiles.

We cover most destinations in Britain & one of our favourites, the **Yorkshire Dales National Park**, is deeply rural, with its stone-walled dales and an abundance of natural beauty, including wild flowers, waterfalls, scars, caves and limestone pavements. **The Dales** are home to a number of features for you to discover, such as the 250ft cliff of **Malham Cove** and **Gordale Scar**. Streams and quaint former lead mining communities are dotted throughout the beautiful valleys, while **The Three Peaks** of Ingleborough, Wharfedale and Pen-y-ghent are extremely rewarding for the keen walker. The challenging long distance trail of the **Dales Way** offers a complete Dales experience.

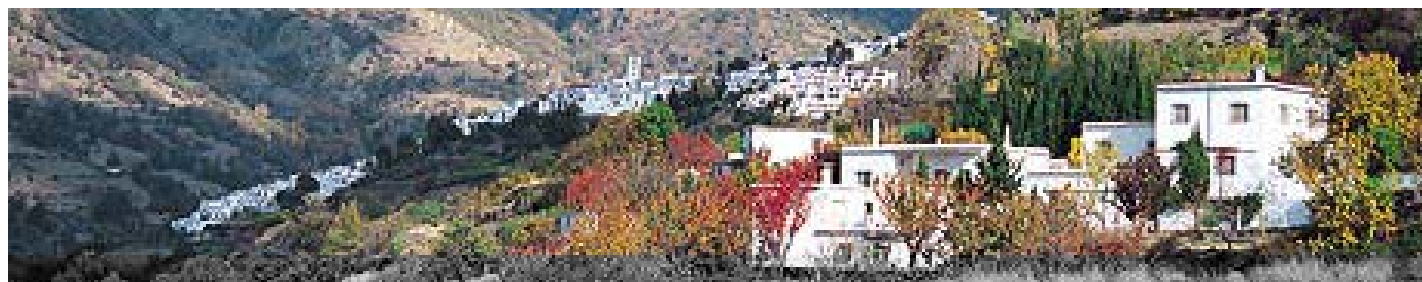
Walking Days - we generally start the day at 9.30am, taking a picnic lunch and returning to the hotel between 5.00pm and 6.30pm, in plenty of time to relax for dinner. Seven night breaks offer five days' walking - one day is left free for independent time or sightseeing.

Short walks are 5 to 7 miles with easy gradients. 275 to 750ft of ascent over a day.

Medium walks are 7 to 9 miles with easy gradients. 375 to 1,075ft of ascent over a day.

Long walks are 9 to 11 miles. Undulating with gentle gradients. 425 to 2,300ft of ascent over a day.

Walking in the Alpujarras Grade 4+ (up to 12M/19km) 3rd - 10th June 2007 (TBC) AU\$2250

Against the backdrop of the snow-covered Sierra Nevada this was the last corner of Moorish Spain and the richer Berber legacy. Our walks follow old mountain routes between villages through deep gorges and lush valleys. Scattered among these dramatic scenes, and clinging to precipices, are the typical whitewashed villages of Le Tahá.

Walking in Cap de Creus Grade 4 (up to 12M / 19km) 10th - 17th June 2007 (TBC) AU\$1190

Dominated by mountains that split the peninsula in two, Cap de Creus contains pine forests, hidden coves, steep cliffs and the monastery of Sant Pere de Rodes. Our routes take us through landscapes of great majesty and variety amidst the terraced hills. Never far from the sea, there are tantalising glimpses of the rocky coastline.

WALKING HOLIDAYS IN FRANCE & SPAIN

A report from our Man On The Vermillion Coast

John Millen our Sherpa route note editor has just returned from the Vermillion Coast on the borders between France & Spain, between the Med & the Pyrenees. This is what he had to say:

Sunset at Collioure. If there had been any doubts as to how this stretch of coastline had got its name they are automatically dispelled by a Royal Flush of rouge. The earthen hues of the soil and schist on the surrounding hillsides has morphed into a similar colour to that glass of Roussillon in my hand, as I sit on the terrace at the 'Templiers Hotel,' overlooked by a dramatic Vaubin fortress. Below me in the bay, two little traditional high-prowed fishing boats jostle against each other in the slight swell. Their bright yellows and reds, almost fluorescent in intensity in this light. They also reflect a time when all the villages around here relied on fishing, especially for anchovies, sardines, dorados and squid, rather than tourism.

The mixture of the light and the fluttering fishing sails were enough to attract some very famous artists for a bit of a break including Matisse, Derain, Dufy, Maillol and Picasso. In fact the whole of the 'Templiers' is a bit of an art museum, filled with some 2000 original paintings. Other artists came to the Vermillion Coast and stayed. The German imigri artist and sculptor, Walter Benjamin, ended up at Port Bou and famously, Salvador Dali Loved Cadaques; having a house nearby in Port Lligat. Perhaps all this impressionistic and abstract art was influenced by a quantity of the of the beautiful Banyuls wines drunk as much as the quality of the light!

The 'Cote de Vermille' is an attractive area of the Mediterranean winding around the hilly peninsulas, bays and inlets between France and Spain, between Collioure and Cadaques. A nice 'out of main season' walking break, when hopefully, weather and temperatures will be ideal for walking.

The walks from Collioure take you high above the coast, through enchanting cork oak forests to the fortress capped ridges that defined the historically wavering Pyrenean border between Spain and France. Two of the walks take you up to mediaeval watch towers with astonishing views from the white beaches off Perpignan to snow encrusted peak of Mount Canigou: the last major bastion of the Pyrenees.

Maybe if it was a bit warmer I would take a swim. There are good bathing opportunities at each of the overnight stops along the way, with clean little beaches and some translucent waters. Unfortunately for me, March sea temperatures are the coldest of the year.

From the local wine sipping capital of Banyuls, it is a stiff hike up to the border ridge above Cerbere and Port Bou. The main thing you notice is how the landscape changes between the countries. Perhaps aided by France's agricultural policies, so many of the vine terraces on that side are immaculately maintained, but as you approach the border; terraces dissolve into the hillsides unmourned and farms are abandoned. Vines have been replaced by a heather and lavender 'maquis' scrub (or is it 'garrique?'), there are less trees; prickly pear makes an appearance. It all appears so much drier. The ravages of Phylloxera in the 1870s wiped out the area's vines, France replanted, but here at least, the Spanish industry never recovered.

Down from the hills Port Bou exists in somewhat of a 1970s time warp, there is a lovely coastal walk along the 'Cami de Ronda' to the tourist resort of Llanca. One short section of path takes me directly along the sea front, and I just about keep feet dry by rock hopping, before arriving at beautiful Garbet beach for a fantastic fish lunch.

From Llanca the trail lifts above the coast and through the abandoned terracing to the huge Romanesque monastic complex of St.Pere de Rodes, built high on the mountainside in the 10th Century to escape the attentions of the coastal raiders who plagued the fishing villages far below. An hour walking around here followed by a nice 10 Euro lunch in the balconied restaurant, and I am ready for the steep descent past Neolithic Dolmans and standing stones to Port de Selva. This working fishing village, set back in tiered streets from the sea front reminds me of a childhood on the Cornish coast. You can go into the fish market and see them ice up and sell the day's catch to the hotels and restaurants that bring their refrigerated lorries from far and wide.

The last walk is a romantic trek over the secluded 'Cap Creus' peninsular to a lighthouse and restaurant at the furthest easterly point on the Spanish mainland. On the way are Benedictine ruins and quiet bays, where in stormier conditions, Roman galleys once foundered. Fortified by a 'cafi con leche' and a 'bocadillo,' I complete

the last 6 km on the 'Cami de Ronda' into the gorgeous whitewash and red tiled town of Cadaques. I celebrate with an ice cream and even the statue of Salvador Dali stares down in approval. Breakers splash over the road and across my way as I walk up to the 'Rocamar Hotel' on its rocky pedestal, over viewing the town and to Cap Creus beyond. Of course picturesque Cadaques is perennially popular with tourists; but out of the main season you can wander amongst the cobbles and the narrow lanes more or less unhindered. Go up to the church to look across the cherry- tiled rooftops and the little white chimneys to the sea, a century away from the timeshares and holiday complexes else where on the Costa Brava.

The Sherpa self-guided Vermillion coast trip can be booked to start on any day but it is an ideal cold weather choice for those travelling from October to Mid June.

INFLIGHT NEWS

In-flight toilets top amenities wish list

What do travellers want most in terms of in-flight amenities? The answer, according to a survey of 2,300 travellers undertaken by TripAdvisor, is a clean and roomy toilet.

TripAdvisor claims to be the largest travel information and advice site on the Internet, with more than four million reviews and opinions covering more than 200,000 hotels and attractions. Its survey showed that 35 per cent of respondents rated cleaner and more spacious bathrooms as the most important comfort feature onboard a flight, while 27 per cent selected a clean blanket or pillow as their top priority.

Other desirable in-flight amenities included noise-cancelling headphones, toiletry kits and anti-germ products.

When asked what luxury they would be most likely to pay for, 54 per cent of respondents picked larger seats and better legroom, and the second choice was a bed.

Bottled water was the most valued complimentary food or beverage, and fruits and vegetables was the second favourite option.

In terms of entertainment, a video screen at every seat was the most important feature, according to 47 per cent of travellers.

HEALTH INFORMATION FOR TRAVEL TRAVELLERS

MEASLES UPDATE - Measles remains a common disease in many countries of the world, including some in Europe and Asia. The risk for exposure to measles to travellers could be high. To protect themselves from measles, travellers should be sure they and their children are fully immunized before travel. Measles is a serious disease: 6%-20% of the people who become ill with measles will also get an ear infection, diarrhoea, or a serious lung infection, such as pneumonia. One of 1,000 people with measles develops inflammation of the brain. In the United States, of every 1,000 people with measles, 1 or 2 may die from complications.

UKRAINE - A measles outbreak that began in February 2005 is ongoing in the Ukraine, most of the cases have been in people 15 years of age or older. Exported cases from this outbreak have been reported in the United States (3), the Russian Federation (9), Belarus (2), and Spain (1).

NORTHERN GREECE - Most of the cases here have occurred in children less than 14 years of age who had not received measles vaccination.

KENYA - The measles outbreak among children in the Eastleigh neighbourhood of Nairobi, Kenya, which began in November 2005, is continuing.

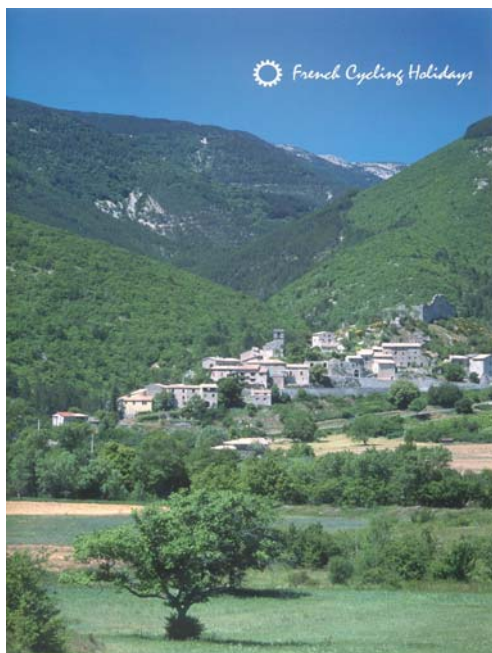
