A WEEK AROUND DUBROVNIK

Grade Easy walking /Sightseeing



Dubrovnik – a city of intriguing narrow streets, squares and fine buildings in one of the most spectacular settings in Eastern Europe – one week, half board. This self-contained old city lies on the coast of the southernmost tip of Croatia's disjointed lands. Originally settled by the Greeks, the city dates back to medieval times. It maintained itself as an independent state until 1801, whilst the rest of Croatia fell under the rule of various European forces.

Among the city's most distinguishing features are the high city walls that encompass its old town, Stari Grad. The fifteenth century walls are 80ft high, punctuated with towers, making them one of the grandest spectacles of this city and possibly responsible for the good preservation of the many fascinating buildings sheltered within. During our week we walk these walls and sightsee within the old town, chosen as a world heritage site by UNESCO. Many of the city's buildings have changed their use over the years; such as the sixteenth century Sponza Palace – now used for art exhibitions and for a photographic memorial to those killed in the recent Civil War.

Although we largely explore Dubrovnik, we'll also get out into the surrounding area for some good walks. From the old harbour we can take a ferry across to nearby Lokrum island to visit its botanical gardens and see its Benedictine Monastery. We can also visit the town of Cavtat for a good easy day out, walking in the vicinity of the town and towards Cilipi. There are generally superb views along the coast and out to the island-dotted sea. An interesting week's holiday in a unique city.

A WEEK IN SIENA, ITALY - CENTRE-BASED WALKING

A great week on sightseeing and easy walking in a wonderful town - half board (breakfast & dinner each day)

The old walled city of Siena is one of the most perfectly preserved medieval towns in Italy. It is built on a starfish of hilltops, with narrow cobbled streets leading from piazza to piazza to burst into the amazing bowl of the Campo where the fourteenth century Palazzo Pubblico rises above the surrounding skyline. The city is full of magnificent buildings and art treasures.

Tuscans boast that their lands produce all that man needs. The patchwork quilt of countryside spread over hundreds of little hills is the result, accented by cypresses, patterned with vines and dusty white lanes, sometimes traversed by slow-moving carts. Beyond the city we explore further afield to see old villages and farms little changed by the centuries, hilltop castles and ruins. In the spring the wild flowers can be a revelation if the weather is kind and, in autumn, the grapes are harvested for wine-making.

Florence is easily reached and a day trip can offer a taste of its magnificent buildings and art. Nearby, the lovely walled town of San Gimignano can also be visited by local bus. Famous for the fourteen towers that interrupt the surrounding Tuscan landscape, the view as you approach is splendid.

We spend much of the time sightseeing on foot with some days walking in the countryside, the combination depending on the weather and the interests of each group.

The area known as Tuscia, was historically the extreme southern part of Etruria, the land inhabited by the Etruscans. Nowadays it is a term used to describe the northern part of Lazio not far from the province of Viterbo. JULY 9 - 'LA FOCE', VAL D'ORCIA - HOME OF MARCHESA ORIGO - Originally built in the 15th century and restored by the Origo family in the mid 1900s, La Foce is the setting for the autobiographical classics, Images and Shadows and War in Val'd'Orcia by Iris Origo. Today, an art and cultural centre, the buildings and

grounds are beautiful and a delight to the eye as the marriage of cultivated and untamed plants and roses link the house, the gardens and the landscape in perfect harmony.

JULY 15 - 'PALAZZO DEL DRAGO' – BOLSENA - located on the eastern shores of Lake Bolsena the medieval town of Bolsena is overlooked by the magnificent Castello Monaldeschi and the Palazzo del Drago. Built in 1690, the Palazzo is an elegant Renaissance building that is still home to Prince Drago and houses an impressive art collection and provides stunning views over the lake from the terrace.

JULY 16 - LA TANA DELL'ISTRICE - CIVITELLA D'AGLIANO - Civitella d'Angliano is a quiet village surrounded by verdant hills and vineyards. Founded in 1026, its medieval history is present today in the watch-tower and rock that dominates the main piazza. Home to the Mottura wine family, La Tana dell'Istrice is a beautifully refurbished manor house of medieval origin. Beneath the hotel are picturesque cellars carved out from the local stone, which provide an ideal environment for the production and conservation of Mottura's sparkling wine. The Mottura Estate nestles on the border of Lazio and Umbria and has been in the Mottura family since 1933.

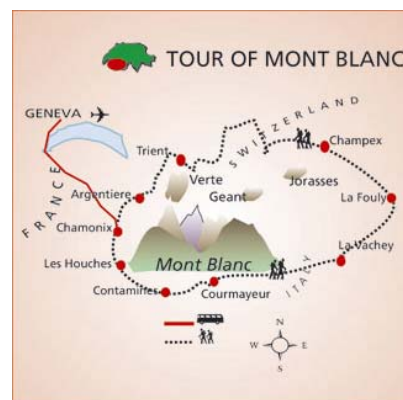
